



## 50Hertz strengthens Berlin's electricity supply

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The underground drilling machine, which will be used to dig the tunnel for the electricity cable under Berlin, was presented during a celebratory event. The machine has been named Candela and will be used at a depth of up to thirty metres. The connection itself (the Berlin Diagonale) was renamed the Franziska line, after the mayor of Berlin. The tunnel activities between the substations of Charlottenburg and Mitte have now started. The line will be an important link in the high-voltage grid in and around the German capital.

## Public consultation on the Federal Development Plan

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Elia has launched the public consultation exercise regarding its 2024-2032 Federal Development Plan. As Belgium's transmission system operator, Elia is legally obliged to do so. The plan describes the (110 kV to 380 kV) transmission grid's future investment needs in order to achieve the energy transition. Through this Federal Development Plan, Elia is trying to respond to the urgent demand to make our energy system more independent, resilient and sustainable. The public consultation began on 2 November and will run until 16 January 2023.

## Elia publishes second CRM auction result

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Elia has published the result of its second CRM auction. This auction took into account the extension of two nuclear reactors and last year's successful auction. In the end, no capacity was contracted. Producers that hold existing production capacity (amounting to a total of 6,682 MW) postponed their participation until the Y-1 auction. The volume of this so-called "Opt-Out IN" choice was deducted from the volume that was being auctioned (demand curve of 6,417 MW). As a result, this year's Y-4 auction for 2026–2027 was fully covered.

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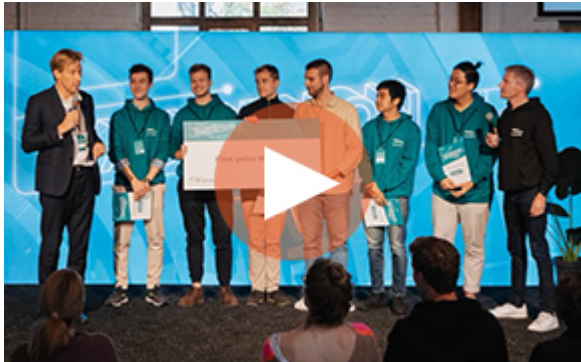
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## SELECT wins second Elia Group hackathon
